



Friends of Bass Straits Islands (FoBSI) is part of Wildcare Tasmania.

We are a volunteer group that has been working primarily on boxthorn control in the Furneaux Islands at the eastern end of Bass Strait since 2002.

We are currently planning our 2015 working bees and looking for volunteers for this year's program.

This year there will be three working bees:

- 1. Wybalenna-Settlement Point on Flinders Island April 10th -19th
- 2. Goose Island April 27th May 10th
- 3. Roydon Island May 16th -31st

You need to be reasonably fit, happy to work hard, to rough it, and be prepared to work upclose-&-personal with a particularly thorny invasive plant. If you're not a current Wildcare member, please (re)join (and tick the FOBSI box if signing up on-line) @ service tas or www.wildcaretas.org.au

Participants will need to provide their own:

- * light-weight tent and bedding (sleeping mat, sleeping bag, pillow)
- sturdy work clothes with long sleeves & legs
- hat & wet-weather gear (& gaiters are good if you have them)
- * work boots with strong soles steel toe cap for those using chainsaws
- daypack with water bottle

Current <u>chainsaw</u>, <u>chemcert</u> and/or <u>first aid</u> certificates are useful. We have some capacity to assist with the costs of obtaining relevant accreditation.


