Feral Oyster Removal 13 April 2015

Seven volunteers gathered on the Lumeah Point foreshore on Sunday 13th April to continue Wildcare's contribution to the oyster removal program being coordinated by the Pipeclay Lagoon Oyster Growers (PLOGA). The low tide window of 7.30am to 10.30am did not deter the troops from an early start and the weather was relatively benign.



Forty-five bags of feral oysters were removed, a fantastic result that possibly indicates that we are getting better at this but also that we are now getting into very heavily infested areas.

The final session will be held on Sunday 24th May with a **6.30am** start. It would be a terrific result for this season's effort if we could clear the shore up to the large tree, placing the corner of the point into play for next season.

By that time of year we should just about catch the sunrise as we start. What a great way to begin the day. Better still if by 9.30am we can gather by the tree and look back at cleared shore all the way to the NW point.
