Selection Criteria

Please complete the following selection criteria if you have not participated in a Wildcare Friends of Freycinet working bee in the past two years.

To assist us in determining your suitability, please briefly list in an email your skills and experience as they relate to each of the following. You may choose to use dot points, or write 1-2 paragraphs (nothing too formal).

- SC1 Ability to work and live with limited supervision in a remote and climatically variable location. (30%)
- SC2 Knowledge of or experience in weed control practices. (20%)
- SC3 Ability to undertake minor building maintenance and / or land management works in order to achieve defined outcomes. (20%)
- SC4 Ability to follow Work Health and Safety practices to ensure a safe working environment. This may include COVID-19 safe working practices, Job Risk Analysis, wearing of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), safe operation and maintenance of tools and equipment, incident and hazard reporting, and manual handling awareness (30%).

Don't forget that if you haven't participated in a Friends of Freycinet working bee in the past two years you need to complete the selection criteria.
